

DIRECT & INDIRECT OBJECT PRONOUNS

	Direct Object	Indirect Object
Yo	ME	ME
Tu	TE	TE
Él, Ella, Usted	LO, LA*	LE
Nosotros/as	NOS	NOS
Vosotros/as	OS	OS
Ellos/as, Ustedes	LOS, LAS**	LES


Person or Thing


Person

*If the Direct Object is a person, instead of a thing, the pronoun is **LE**

If the Direct Object is a person, instead of a thing, the pronoun is **LES

Ejemplo

"Ayer compré un regalo a mi esposa para San Valentín"

Yesterday I bought a gift to my wife for Valentine's

1) Determine what's what in the sentence using the verb ("compré") and Interrogative pronouns:

¿Qué? / ¿Quién? = What/Who [received the action of the verb]? → It tells you the **Direct Object**

¿Para quién? = For whom [was that action intended]? → It tells you the **Indirect Object**

	[yo]	→	SUBJECT
· ¿Qué compró?	<i>un regalo</i>	→	D.O.
· ¿Para quién compró?	<i>para mi esposa</i>	→	I.O.

2) Substitute:

- the D.O. for its pronoun --> un regalo = **lo**

- the I.O. for its pronoun --> para mi esposa = **le**

3) Re-write the sentence using now the Direct & Indirect Object Pronouns, and place them before the verb. The order is:

1- I.O. / 2- D.O. / 3- Verb

"Ayer ~~lo~~ compré para San Valentín"



"Ayer se lo compré para San Valentín" *

*If both pronouns begin with the letter "L", the first one (I.O.) has to be switched to "se"
