

Por

The preposition **por** has the following English equivalents.

- *by, by means of*

Vamos **por** avión (*tren, barco, ...*).
We're going by plane (train, ship, ...).

Nos hablamos **por** teléfono mañana.
We'll talk by (on the) phone tomorrow.

- *through, along*

Me gusta pasear **por** el parque y **por** la playa.
I like to stroll through the park and along the beach.

- *during, in (time of day)*

Trabajo **por** la mañana.
I work in the morning.

- *because of, due to*

Estoy nervioso **por** la entrevista.
I'm nervous because of the interview.

- *for = in exchange for*

Piden 1.000 dólares **por** el coche.
They're asking \$1,000 for the car.

Gracias **por** todo.
Thanks for everything.

- *for = for the sake of, on behalf of*

Lo hago **por** ti.
I'm doing it for you (for your sake).

- *for = duration (often omitted)*

Vivieron allí (**por**) un año.
They lived there for a year.

Por is also used in a number of fixed expressions.

por Dios
por ejemplo
por eso
por favor
por fin

for heaven's sake
for example
that's why
please
finally

Para

Although **para** has many English equivalents, including *for*, it always has the underlying purpose of referring to a goal or destination.

- *in order to + infinitive*

Regresaron pronto **para** estudiar.
They returned soon (in order) to study.

Estudian **para** conseguir un buen trabajo.
They're studying (in order) to get a good job.

- *for = destined for, to be given to*

Todo esto es **para** ti.
All this is for you.

Le di un libro **para** su hijo.
I gave her a book for her son.

- *for = by (deadline, specified future time)*

Para mañana, estudien **por** y **para**.
*For tomorrow, study **por** and **para**.*

La composición es **para** el lunes.
The composition is for Monday.

- *for = toward, in the direction of*

Salió **para** el Ecuador ayer.
She left for Ecuador yesterday.

- *for = to be used for*



Compare the example at the right to **un vaso de agua** = *a glass (full) of water.*

El dinero es **para** la matrícula.
The money is for tuition.

Es **un vaso para agua**.
It's a water glass.

- *for = as compared with others, in relation to others*

Para mí, el español es fácil.
For me, Spanish is easy.

Para (ser) extranjera, habla muy bien el inglés.
For (being) a foreigner, she speaks English very well.

- *for = in the employ of*

Trabajan **para** el gobierno.
They work for the government.
